Gazing at a near future Final Product Weekly Report 1/21/19 to 1/27/19

After the week of Research Showcase, it was essential to get back on track and make sure that everything ran smoothly for this week. While also knowing that there would be a Reedy Tennis tournament this week, which would require missing ISM on Friday, it was necessary to stay on track with all the work this week would bring. Knowing that this would be a complication for the week, the assessment needed to be constructed in advance.
