This week, the second interview of the ISM journey was conducted. Dr. Lao, a female optometrist at Eyes In Sight, generously set aside some time for the interview. Additionally, Dr. Lao was a mentor to a student at Liberty High School last year, through the ISM program. Also, new contacts will need to be cold-called, in order to keep the rate of interviews constant. The goal is to have a nice and clean presentation, in order to show my classmates the work that has gone into the research thus far in my optometry studies.
